

INTRODUCTION

This monograph, No. 2 of "The American Collector Series," occupies a curious niche in the history of card collecting. Under other circumstances, the 56 pages of information it encompasses should have been integrated into the 1960 edition of The American Card Catalog to create an updated volume of that book in the mid-sixties. For reasons never explained, this information was never utilized and no new version of the ACC has ever been printed.

The first card catalog printed in the United States was compiled and issued by Jefferson Burdick in 1939. It was called <u>The United States Card Collectors Catalog</u> and the 90 pages of material it contained would seem dull by modern standards. At the time, however, it was remarkable evidence of the emergence of a vital new hobby -card collecting- which had been virtually unknown to the public just five years before. Jeff Burdick's articles in "Hobbies" magazine and his own publication, "The Card Collectors Bulletin," were instrumental in rallying isolated collectors throughout America into an inter-communicating network.

Burdick himself was far more interested in cataloging and checklisting sets than he was in pricing them. Even so, he realized that by writing about cards he was inevitably influencing their values. Jeff must have understood that he would be pricing himself out of the market for some cards, but his concern was for fairness and for the well-being of collectors in general. So he went ahead with his "Bulletins" and card catalogs and published prices based on his own personal experiences and those of fellow hobbyists.

The first "American Card Catalog" was issued in June, 1946 (the name change from "United States" to "American" was appropriate since the 1946 ACC had newly-organized sections on Canadian and Central & South American cards); this was followed by updated versions in 1953, 1956, and 1960. To provide collectors with the latest information between catalogs, reports about new issues were printed in "The Card Collectors Bulletin."

At some point between 1953 and 1959, the formal responsibility for cataloging new issues was assumed by Charles Barker of St. Louis. Barker -known as "Buck" to one and all- was not only a baseball enthusiast, but a respected expert on the game (he often roamed the stacks at the "Sporting News" library researching games and players). To this day, some baseball card collectors refuse to believe that Buck Barker, the baseball nut, had anything to do with non-sports cards. Those collectors obviously didn't know Buck Barker!

From November, 1960 to February, 1972, Buck Barker published sixteen separate lists of new sets and discoveries in "The Card Collectors Bulletin." He solicited information from collectors around the country and the volume of his correspondence is a testament to the force of his personality and his commitment to Burdick's enterprise. Even after Jeff died in 1963, the flow of information never faltered because Barker and Charles Bray, editor of the "Bulletin," had ACC publisher Woody Gelman's assurance that a new edition of the catalog was in the works.

COMMEMTOES---The biggest news to baseball collectors this year has been Post's Baseball Star Cards (#183 McMillan is scarce, found only on 9-1/2 oz Raisin Bran). A considerable number of foreign cards are coming in, especially thru Canada. Many are made in Holland, and in addition to the ML Gum issues, we have the R814 Music Stars (picture of saxaphone & trumpet on back, a bi-lingual issue) and V413 Filmstar "Quartet" (which has 4 names on each card like Authors). A most unusual item sent in by Jeff Morey was Y84, a set of tract cards sold by the American Tract Society, which probably are given away free by the purchasers. Pres Orem found W514 baseball strip cards with Streett's Mother's Bread and Besta Cake printed on the back. This column will miss Pres, one of our best sources, especially for the Pacific Coast, now that he says he has given up collecting for publishing books, mainly his own fine baseball tomes. Ron Chaix found 60 more R707-2 Topps Planes cards, quite a surprise. And Topps is trying Giant Size 2-1/2 X 4-3/4 cards, with 2 sets (Valentines & Cars) already out. Ray Madieros has a 1942 set of W705 Red Sox pictures -there should be some more of these ballclub issues turning up, as it's certain the Catalog doesn't have all of them. A whole group of new card sets without gum have been published by Nu-Cards, Nuway, Ad-Trix, and other firms, featuring Monsters, Dinosaurs, Baseball and more monsters. It is quite possible that the R738 listings in the Dec 1960 listing will be changed to "W" as these may have been gum-less. Jeff Morey, by the way, is going in big for printing his own baseball postcards..Wonder why Topps marked their "Mars Attacks" cards (and the Elvis Presley set too) with Bubbles, Inc? Some phase of big business, no doubt.. The rage this summer has been the baseball set on the backs of Post cereals- getting 200 cards takes a lot of eating.. Post in Canada has the same set, but in both French and English, while another division of General Foods (Chicago area only) has the same set with the players in the same poses, but the Jello photos show a little more of the player. Also #19 is Aspromonte in Jello, but Colavito in both Post sets.. The Salada Tea and Junket Desert baseball coins show a number of varieties (and there must be others).. Team changes for #7,39,52,68,86,88,108,123,129,135,146,158,173,176 (in each case the pose is the same, but the enlargement is different and the uniforms are doctored). Position varieties for #7,47,65,187, while #97 Wynn has two different poses, and #127 Maury Wills comes with blue or red uniform numbers.. Can it be that Wills is again chewing gum? He has yet to appear on a Topps card.. Here's the details of the 1962 Topps BB varieties. Card #22 (1st Checklist) has an error card showing the 2nd series on the back.. (Before we forget, some 20 cards-#114, 122, 123, etc come with a very green background color variety)..#129 Walls faces left or right on his two cards..#134 Hoeft has two distinct portrait shots..#139 comes as Ruth or Reniff..and the same "hands up" Reniff shot appears as #159, as does a Reniff portrait. #134 Kunkel is action or portrait..#174 Willey has a cap or is bareheaded..#176 Yost and #190 Moon come as batters or portrait shots..Art Mackosky's name appeared as an old Dodger Fan in Joe King's June 30 Sporting News column.. Ray Madieros, Airforceman now in Madrid (Spain) sent some fine postcards of soccer teams and stadiums, and of course the bullfight arena..We are all happy to hear his family has joined him..Jim Nowell discovered #65 Mele in T234 (1954 Red Man) comes with Baltimore and Chisox uniforms..He also reports Alta-Dena Dairy of Monrovia Calif issued two sets of bottlecaps in 1961, Presidents (35), and States (50?)..We've squared the circle- cigarette picture cards are supposed to have started on the blank cards placed in packages as stiffeners, no?..Well, Leaf Gum's "Untouchables" booklets have a blank card stiffener in the package..looks like someone was asleep as they should have made a card of the cardboard.. Sports Hobbyist is back in business with Charles Brooks and Frank Nagy as publishers this time. Gaining popularity is the collection of schedule cards issued by the various sports teams and advertisers...J. Warren Bowman (Bowman Gum) died in April at St. Petersburg Fla at 67 (surviving is his 6th wife, so he evidently had an eventful life before and after he sold out to Topps in 1955)..We keep running across Japanese tatoos, games, etc in nickel packages of candy, but have not listed them so far, as they are quite haphazard.. Same for Valomilk candy with 1-5/8" circles listing just the names of state capitals, and Mallo Cup's 2" square Play Money coupons..Here's a new twist from Dennis Snell..Dandy Gum of Denmark has invaded the Canadian market, but the movie star pictures enclosed are marked "Printed in Holland"..it looks like they were furnished by Maple Leaf Gum..We hear O-Pee-Chee of Canada has re-
