





After much deliberation, a committee specially-charged by the Council of the Cartophilic Society of Great Britain has proposed a series of recommendations for use in grading cards. These suggestions were incorporated into a "Cartophilic Society Grading Guide" -reproduced below- which appeared on page 3784 of the Jan/Feb 1986 issue of "Notes and News." In addition to this printed guide, individuals and entities advertising sales and auctions of tobacco cards were notified in advance of the Society's intentions and invited to study and, hopefully, elect to adopt the impending standards. The Society's letter of notification expressed the hope that standard grade descriptions might be "adopted internationally and would therefore enable prospective purchasers to buy or bid by post with confidence in the condition of the cards being offered."



MINT

The cards must give the appearance of never having been handled, i.e. be in the condition in which they would have come from the printers. Imperfections in the printing process would not affect this (e.g. cards cut slightly off-centre, differences in intensity of ink, marks caused by defective printing plates).

VERY GOOD

Cards completely clean back and front with no damage. In particular corners would be untouched, but edges might show slight signs of wear.

GOOD

Minor blemishes might be visible, due to handling or age, and there could be slight damage to corners. No creases or stains visible.

FAIR

Cards showing signs of considerable handling and consequential corner or edge damage. Or a card from one of the above categories with one defect, such as a crack, foxing, dirty mark.

POOR

A card that is soiled, damaged or badly worn, or with a serious defect, such as back missing or badly cut down in size.

Cartophilic Society Grading Guide

USCS members know that we have addressed the subject of grading in past issues, examining both the philosophical and practical complexities of the problem. We have already adopted a set of standards and we only need ask if those of CSGB match our own. We find that they do not. The major obstacle to concurrence is idiom. Our grading nomenclature is firmly established in the public mind and to attempt an overhaul at this point is senseless. America's "excellent" is, and will remain, England's "very good." Furthermore, USCS has specified that "mint" = "perfect," which would remove this misused term from the marketplace. CSGB would allow printing imperfections in this grade, which we think is a contradiction in terms. Many cards pulled straight from the package have unacceptable defects: would you pay top dollar for these? Ultimately, it is up to the collector to regulate the hobby. If you buy from reputable dealers offering complete satisfaction, you will have little reason to complain.

While selling at one of Florida's rare paper ephemera conventions this February, I ran into a dealer from Indiana who dealt in postcards. Like most postcard dealers, he had a good selection of trade cards and other paper items. When I asked him for tobacco cards he pointed to several albums. Opening these, I found the more common cards issued by Allen & Ginter, Duke and Kinney. They had all been removed from a scrap album and all had suffered major back damage. Although I was disappointed in these, I continued to look through his albums. Finally I found a complete set of N229, Kinney's Famous (American) Running Horses. Although they were clean and in reasonable condition, the price of \$200 was too high. By this time I was pretty discouraged by the combination of mediocre condition and high prices, but the next page brought a pleasant surprise. On it was a row of 16 Allen & Ginter Race Horse photos from set N52. Although it is a photo card issue, N52 is rarely encountered - these were the first I had ever seen in 16 years of collecting.

The postcard dealer had these priced at \$25 apiece. Trying to act only mildly interested, I asked for a price on all sixteen. "\$320" was the reply. I said "no thanks" but inquired why they were priced so high. He answered that he knew a couple of horse fanciers who paid very good prices for such material. I felt like asking him why, if that were the case, did he still have the cards, but I just walked away. I really wanted those cards but I couldn't afford to pay \$20 each for them.

Since this was a two-day event, my strategy was to wait until Sunday to make another approach. As I took another look at the cards, I decided to offer him \$100. He shook his head no, so I said "make me a final offer." At this point I nearly gave up because he picked up his calculator and started punching buttons. After much deliberation, he turned to me and said "\$160," which was exactly one-half of his opening-day price. I mumbled something about having a "bad show" - which was true - and countered with a bid of \$130, which he accepted without hesitation.

In making this deal, I paid more than I thought the cards were worth. If I were strictly a dealer I would never have considered buying the cards for \$8 each, but as a collector it was difficult to walk away from them knowing how difficult they are to find. Among the cards I found ten which were previously unlisted (these are marked with an asterisk in the list below) and it now appears probable that the set total is 50.



The fourth part of our USCS Price Guide deals with the group of inserts and premiums commonly called "silks." Except for the cloth or felt inserts and premiums, silks are probably the least-collected of all the cartophilic tobacco ephemera. They are also the most under-rated and undervalued. This lack of popularity stems from a variety of reasons.

First of all, there is some confusion about the word "silk": are these items truly fabricated of silk? At least one manufacturer (S. Anargyros, maker of "Turkish Trophies" cigarettes) refers to them as "designs on satin." The dictionary states that "satin" is a particular pattern of weave so conceivably the Turkish Trophies satins could be made of silk. A trip to the dressmaker or chemical analyst might resolve the question of silk or satin, but since the former is the term commonly employed, we will continue to use it.

Secondly, there has never been -to our knowledge- a comprehensive attempt to describe and checklist the various silk series in clear and orderly fashion. Of the several compilations, the most notable is the unfortunately fragmented listing in the World Tobacco Indices. Most collectors prefer to know the basic details about sets they consider pursuing and this information has not been readily available in respect to silks. Of course, it is only fair to point out that the researchers studying these items are few in numbers and that many sets are scarce enough to elude their view.

The most compelling dissuasion to silk collecting, however, is the mediocre condition in which most specimens are found. Even the most exquisite design can be rendered unpalatable by dirt, creases, unraveling, etc. Silks are especially vulnerable to the ravages of time and clean, top-condition types are in short supply.

Our evaluations are based upon our own notes and observations and those of Society members Ken Silverman and Charles Reuter, Special Consultants for this project. The prices stated are for a single item in "excellent" condition and are expressed in U.S. dollars. In Mr. Silverman's words, an "excellent" silk must be bright, not faded, and show no fraying, stains, wrinkles, soiling, tears or holes. Only medium or large sizes may have folds (as sent from the factory). Dimensions in our list are for the most part from samples on hand, but expect variation. The term "anonymous" indicates that the manufacturer or brand is not printed on the silk. In some cases, only a factory designation appears and this has been noted below. The abbreviations (N) and (NN) mean "numbered" and "not numbered" and a "K" means "known"; these appear in conjunction with the set total, also in parentheses. For reference purposes, the number immediately following the set title is the World Tobacco Index designation. As a general rule, a silk with the most commonly-encountered defects would be worth 40% of the "excellent" price.
