TOBACCO CARDS BEFORE 1900 - CONCLUSION. This Bulleton completes the listings of U.S. Tobacco Card Inserts, as reported to date. Of course, some other sets will be found, but these lists include practially all of the major and most of the minor sets issued.

Many of the sets listed herein are by the smaller companies and probably some of them local and limited distribution. Consequently they are not as common as many of the sets previously listed. In a few inst-

ances listing is made from a single known card.

OTHER ITEMS. Some collectors will want at least a representative showing of Foreign Cigarette Cards issues. There are many distinctive sets from Canada, Mexico, Cuba, Japan, China, New Zealand, England, Germany, Scandinavia, and other countries.

Also, many card collectors will want the highly interesting cards

issued in this country with coffee, soda, candy, gum, and the old trade cards of all kinds which are beyond description.

Other Tobacco inserts of the U.S. are silks, flannels, rugs, leathers, buttons, and pins - to give them their common names. While none are as popular as the card sets, they are all quite beautiful, and are

collected by many.

CONDITION. A correspondent recently put me "on the spot" by asking what "fine" condition means. It means, roughly, the card as originally issued, or nearly so. At least without disfiguring, tears, creases or stains and, with the corners not too badly worn off. In this condition they are easily worth the prices indicated. The wise collector will not be too critical of condition, especially in the older issues, as many of these may never be found "fine".

FUTURE BULLETINS. No plans for additional Bulletins have been made at this time. It is quite probable that later on sufficient material will be gathered for other issues. If, and when, such issues are ready all wno receive this Bulletin will be notified. Nothing may be expected before the end of the year. In the mean while, ideas and suggestions are solicited from all. The Card Colum in HOBBIES is yet to begin, but it

is hoped that room for it may be found soon.

Beginning collectors soon find that collecting these cards is quite different from some hobbies. It is real collecting. There are no deal ers with huge stocks ready to supply complete sets of anything desired. Usually such sets are built up a bit at a time and require considerable search and expense.

These cards are a type of AMERICANA which is fast becoming scarce. Old collections, during the past years, have been "thrown out" by efficient housewives and so, are mostly lost. Such agencies as the Salvation Army in former years picked up many of them at Spring housecleaning

time but, no radays seldom see any at all.

No one can expect to make a complete collection. It is a difficult task to complete even a dozen or two sets. It is a case of getting what ever is available, but every collector may take some satisfaction in the fact that he probably has at least a few items that other collector do not have.

All cards in color unless stated as actual photos. Average size of small cards 12x24 inches. Prices indicated are for fine condition. An asterick (*) indicated cards do not have a series name.

Various designs of cards from sets listed in BULLETIN No.3 are sometimes found on a thick paper and without printing on the backs. These are usually cut out from advertising hangers used in tobacco stores at the time that the cards were current. These hangers were about lox22 inches with a large central design surrounded by card designs. Generally the cards overlapped to some extent and show thus in the cut outs.

Many of the old small photo Actresses and some Prizefighters were witnout inscriptions and so cannot be identified as to issuer. A set of minature playing cards may be by Kinney.
