## UNDERSTANDING CANADA'S CARDS

Those who collect Canada, and most do to some extent, soon run into a confusion of varieties that defies comprehension. Because of the relationship with England, and the proximity of the United States, it is natural that the Dominion cards partake of both these countries. In fact, the sets may roughly be divided into three classes: 1-those with designs distinctly Canadian and issued there only. 2-those with designs originating in England. 3- and those designs originating in the U.S.

To add to the confusion, quite a number of sets appear without a series title or name of issuer shown. Many have blank backs. These bothersome sets come in each of the 3 classes mentioned, and in many cases it is all but impossible to find out whether they were issued with cigarettes, candy, or some other product.

Canada has no 19th century cards, as far as known, except those of D. Ritchie of Montreal, which are very scarce. Most of the Imperial sets appeared in the 20s and there has been a scattering of all types since. Many cards of Gum, Inc. of Phila and Goudey of Boston were issued in Canada by their affiliates, but usually with different title and different quantity and numbering. All are printed in Canada.

Not all Imperial sets are English adaptations. Among the sets issued only in Canada are Birds of Canada, Canadian History, Poker Hands, Hockey sets, Lacrosse sets, Motor Cars, How to play golf, Famous English Actresses, Smokers Golf, and possibly a few other scarcer ones. The recent Aircraft Spotter Series are package designs and these, incidentally, come with two designs for each number (up to at least #56) plus others in both English and French - a most interesting tangle.

Set #20 may be incorrectly listed. They are inscribed "Millbank Cigarettes" and likely are a product of British-American Tobacco for use in various parts of the Empire. One catalog calls them Australian. #51 was used in the U.S. by coffee and other products but this is the only known tobacco use. The designs are probably a stock series of German origin with only the backs printed locally.

The Catalog listing is only a rough guide to the more prominent sets. Unlisted are several sets of English origin, which seem more English than Canadian. Often the change is very slight, such as a mere change of 1/ to 25¢ for an album price. Many plain-back-no-issuer-stated types are yet unlisted, and of course, others which are purely English will never be listed, even though distributed in Canada. To get all these in order is a job for the future, and a difficult one.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH IN BRIEF

**GREETINGS.** At this time - a little early perhaps - we extend our usual good wishes for the Christmas Season and the New Year. Would that we could see you all and tell you personally, but Bulletin readers are scattered from England westward to New Zealand, and even an individual greeting is more than we can undertake. We hope another Christmas will find more Peace on Earth than at present and happier collecting.

**CURRENT ISSUES.** Some time ago we said that we believed no cards were being issued at the present time. We overlooked the Dixie Ice Cream issues, which besides the Sports and Movie Star series, includes the "United Nations at War" - an exceedingly interesting set, coming in both the lids and large 8x10 cards. MacDonalds of Canada apparently are also using inserts as we have seen a continuation of their plane



and ship designs with redemption dates as late as Jan. 1945. Mr. Robert Mildrum also recently sent us a set of 24 cards with "girlie" designs and in standard gum size. They bear the copyright imprint of Gum, Inc. Phila. but he states that they are being sold in sets and not used as inserts. Probably intended for gum use, but no gum to use with.

Lt. Col. Baarslag, mentioned in #32, is now in European service. Just before leaving he had an interesting manuscript on Card Collecting accepted by Esquire Magazine. We hope it has early publication. Mr. Paul Lazarick notes that cigarette cards have mention in Oct. 9 of Mek-eels stamp News - very unusual for such specialized publications.

## NEWS NOTES

**OBAK.** Mr. Paul S. Masser sends in some additions to the Obak Base Ball checklist. The original list noted four cards in the 1910 series with different quantity inscriptions on the back. It would seem that part of the series was printed as a "Series of 150" but that most of it carried the "Series of 175" inscription. Possibly the entire first 150 cards were so altered. We are not quite yet certain what happened. Mr. Bray says he has 179 different cards as listed, of which only 22 have the "150" inscription. Mr. Masser notes that if a player played in the league in both 1910 and 1911, his 1911 picture is in the same uniform as for 1910, while newcomers for 1911 are shown in their new uniforms. We will endeavor to get more data on this later.

**BUCHNER.** This issue lists the early Buchner Baseball series. There probably are two series of these, but there seems to be no satisfactory manner of separating them. The list, like the Goodwin photos, is unnumbered and is given only for what interest Bulletin readers may have for it. The cards themselves can be collected satisfactorily only by lot purchases or approval selections. These lists are a composite of the best four collections of them known. The designs of the Buchner cards cannot be taken as true likenesses of the players as many use the same design with changes in coloring and inscriptions.

**LEATHERS.** In issue #31 we said that none of the large leather premiums of the Helmar-Turkish Trophies were known. We have since acquired three of these rare items (#171-UB flag; #127-Cobb; #76-Yale bulldog). This proves that at least part of this vast series was actually issued. The pieces are cut to natural hide shape and are most attractive. We would value them at not less than \$2.00 each.

**BIDS.** In the fourth Mail Sale, many who must need the cards failed to bid on Lot #20, apparently scared by the high private valuation. (Catalog would have been \$180.) Likewise, many do not bid on the candy and gum issues because their catalog valuation goes into high figures. It should be remembered that recent gum issues have been selling at a substantial discount from catalog in lots, although many of the sets are so scarce that collectors of these cards will gladly pay more than catalog for their wants. Bidders are urged again to use these valuations only as a guide and to "bid whatever the lot is worth to you". U.S. Tobacco issues, for the most part, have been bringing full normal valuation or better, especially if in good condition, but bargains may be picked up in any classification. A few lots in this sale got no bids whatever, due, we think, to the sale being too long. Bidders concentrated on certain lots to the extent of their purchasing ability with the result that some were passed by entirely. The Fifth, and future sales are being held to fewer lots. There is strong doubt that it will be possible to hold one of these sales with each issue of the Bulletin because of the difficulty of obtaining suitable material.

**LOTS.** In a former issue we stated that there is no standard lot for mail sales, but that one should consist of the same type of cards and have a value of at least \$2. We have tried to stretch this rule sufficiently to include all that has been sent in for sale but it has been difficult. Mr. Bray spent an afternoon and evening with us early in November and a lot of the time was spent in debating on how to handle the sale material which some collectors sent in. As collectors obtain these sale lots, they are bound to accumulate duplicates and one of the objects of the sales is to pass this material along to those who do need it. However, collectors should wait until they accumulate enough for a fair sized lot before sending it in. We are sure that this policy will work out to the advantage of all. We also believe that items like silks, flannels, gum cards, etc can best be sold in large all different lots, with the possible exception of a few of the



better sets which can sometimes be offered to advantage in separate large lots. Mr. Bray wants to accommodate everyone as much as possible in these matters and will continue to do the best possible.

BRITISH. The Fifth sale offers additional lots of fine English cards in large assortments covering sports, historical, and almost every conceivable subject. English cards of the past 20 years exist in much larger quantities than U.S. cards, although they are gradually becoming scarcer and values consequently rising. This latter is seen strongly in the 1944 English catalogues. These cards are all most interesting and if bought right, there is little need to worry about the investment end of the purchase.

Collectors are being offered practically everything that comes on the market, and the Fifth Sale (above) contains many scarce items that may not come on the market again. Everyone will be pleased to know that some of the famous Edwards collection will be sold. The fifth Sale includes several lots from it, and we hope that more will



be released as Mrs. Edwards and her son have time to sort through the cards. Included in this sale is the duplicate Military collection, being the largest lot of these cards to come on the market, and including two Vaticans and several other scarce minors. Condition is far above normal for these cards, which are thin and easily bent.

In valuing lots, it should be noted that U.S. and Canada CARDS are listed at 4 times catalog with a 10¢ minimum for 19th issues and 2 times catalog for 20th issues, both plus 40% or 20% for complete or short sets. That applies to TOBACCO ISSUES ONLY; all non-card inserts and other items use the original catalog figures. Individual price increases as in Bull.#22 are also used. British cards are now priced from the London Standard Catalog. It should be noted that these rates are commonly discounted, unlike the U.S. and Canada issues. The amount of discount varies from 25% to about 65% depending on age, price, etc., etc.
