C A R T O P H I L Y - By G. Hindmarch (Eng.)

The hobby of collecting digarette cards has expanded rapidly in England during the past decade. It has always been popular with small boys, who made a practice of asking passers-by in the street for cards from their pockets, and possibly that is why serious collectors were rather shy of confessing their hobby. With the coming of the war, cards disappeared from the packets, but the dessation of small boy street collecting has been more than offset by the organization of adult collectors into two national clubs, and most collections have increased considerably during the war.

Cigarette cards have been issued by many firms since the and of the last century, the total number of different sets is probably in the region of 6 - 7,000, but not very much is known about many of the earlier cards. The variety of subjects is very great. Many of the earliest cards dealt with actresses and beauties, closely followed by many sets of uniforms, which resulted in some very colorful cards, khaki at that time being an unknown color. Natural history, and Sporting series have been very plentiful, while the spate of film-star series just before the war tried the patience of many collectors.

The large number of cards available leads naturally to specialization. Most collectors begin by collecting every card they can lay their hands on, but unless they have a very great deal of time and money to devote to the hobby they ultimately decide to get only such subjects as appeal to them most. Some want only cards given with cigarettes, and disdain those given with chocolates and household products, while others may collect footballers, of which there are many sets available. Some continue to amass sets of every kind. Probably the biggest collection in the country is around 5000 different sets, many of which are probably from the Continent and America. Any collection of over 1000 sets may be regarded as a large one, as the older sets rapidly become more difficult to obtain, and the supply is obviously limited, while the demand grows continually.

As a result of the difficulty of completing the older sets, a form of collecting known as "TYPE" collecting has grown up. The type collector aims at securing one or two cards from as many sets as possible, and even one card from some series is difficult to obtaim. By this means the collector secures representative cards of many sets and can centinue to complete such of them as interest him most.

The war years have allowed many collectors to fill up large gaps in their collections of British cards, and cards which were not very popular before the war are now sought for, more scarce and expensive to buy. In consequence catalog value of a set is now no criterion of the interest or production of the cards in many cases.

Another branch of the hobby is that of errors and varieties. There is not much literature on this, but many exist. Some are well known while others await discovery by any collector with plenty of cards and the time to compare them. Most of the ones I have "discovered" myself have turned cut to be well known to other collectors to whom I have shown them, so that my initial jubilation usually suffers eclipse.

There is at the moment too little contact between American and English collectors. My own efforts in this cirection have been almost balked by the dollar shortage over here, which means that I am unable

to make even modest payments to America i'r carls and publications. If any reader would like nore information about English cards, or Cartophily, as we call the hobby over here, I shall be happy to give any help that I can.

Dale Carnegie wrote a book telling How to Win Friends. In three words we can tell you How to Lose them: WRITE A CATALOG. The formula never fails. Already we know of three good friends who have crossed us off their lists and we hate to speculate on how many wore will do so AFTER publication. And we only meant to be helpful!

Many, we know, will be disappointed in the physical appearance of the Catalog as it will appear smaller than the old one, although it will have many more pages. That is due to loose leaf binding and one side

of page printing, which wasn't practical to continue at this time.

The new numbering system may seem complicated at first, but a little use will show its merits, we are sure. This style was suggested by two or three collectors, notably Mr. Masser and Mr. Barker who each outlined it substantially in the form used. Credit should also be given to Sgt. Wagner who drew the cover design, and to vic White, Mr. Christie, Col. Sturtevant, Dr. Kurzrok, Lionel Carter, and Mr. Bray, all of whom

were especially helpful in one way or another.

We hope to catch up soon with our normal letter writing much of which was temporarily suspended. We spent I6 full days in April and 2 more in May getting copy ready for the printer. Work actually was begun nearly a year ago and considerably oppy written before April. Few will realize the amount of time required to whip such data into shape. There will be numerous evidences of hasty work which it was impossible to correct without copious rewriting, for which there was insufficient time, unless publication was delayed for many months. We cannot say when copies can be mailed. We hope before mid-year, but it depends on the amount of time the printer can devote to it in the next few weeks.

We are happy to announce that Mr. C.Glidden Osborne has kindly consented to act as agent for the Catalog in Great Brita in. This will be a great help to collectors in Britain and we all certainly appreciate Mr. Osborne's assistance. During the war he was pretty busy as head of the British-American Ambulance Unit but now hopes to have more leisure to devote to cards. English collectors should not write to Mr. Osborne at this time as details have not been worked out at this

time. Further announcement will be made later.

We wish also to thank the many who sent in advertisements. Incidentally, we have increased the print order to I250 which will give them

a still further value for their expenditure.

Needless to say, we are glad to have this job practically finished. When this Bulletin goes into the mails on the 27th we hope to have some time to devote to our own collection which has been sadly neglected of late. In fact, we have done so little with it that someone recently got the idea that we had no personal collection at all.
