LIEBIG ISSUES by G.Hindmarch.

Messrs. Liebig, of Antwerp, Belgium, have issued a long stream of trade cards over a period of many years. The vast majority of them are in sets of six, but there are occasional sets of twelve, and sometimes a first and second series of six cards each. The cards vary slightly in size but average around three by four inches. Each set has either all vertical or all horizontal designs.

Most of my cards are printed in French, but the cards are commonly printed in German and in Flemish. I have odd sets printed in Spanish and Italian, and one card in a language which I have not yet identified. The cards date from 1872, and were issued fairly frequently until 1914, by which date I, IOI different series had been issued. There was then, of necessity, a break until 1919, when issuance was resumed, and 330

further sets appeared when war once more intervened in 1940.

The general standard of production is remarkably high and in many cases it is superb. The cards are printed in a full range of colors and the artists have spared no pains to make attractive pictures. In this they have been assisted by having a large card to work on, which gives scope for backgrounds and supplementary details. For example one set shows "The Bources of Impirtant Rivers". In the picture of the Nile starting from Lake Victoria-Wyanza, we see the abundant papyrus reeds which obstruct the river's passage, crocodiles on the bank, and some of the aquatic birds which abound. By the rapids of the upper reaches of the Mississippi we see red Indians fishing. Alongside the young Yang-tse-Kiang, the greatest river of China, a Tibetan shepherd with a pipe a yard long stands beside his black-headed charges. Where the Amazon leaves Lake Lauricocha, we see the remains of an aqueduct, and other remnants of the ancient civilization of the Incas.

If we look through a targe collection of Liebig cards, arranged in order of dates of issue, we can see their development, which in many ways is similar to the development of digarette and other cards. earliest issues were by way of being advertisement cards, the object being to display the pot of meat extract which is the commodity which the firm manufactures. Then comes a period when we have pictures of birds, flowers, children, women - a period when the cards are no longer pure advertisement cards, but they do not illustrate any particular subject. There is as yet no descriptive natter on the reverse, only recipes and testimonials. Soon we find the sets have a more definate object to illustrate, styles of architecture, composers, geological periods, and nationalities, but the earliest set which I have which carries a definate explanation on the reverse as well as a general title under the illustration is one entitled "Magic Explained" issued in 1894. Thereafter explanatory notes become more common and more elaborate and by I904 the descriptive text is firmly established.

With so many sets issued it is difficult to pick out any individual ones which may be of greatest interest. If you like Nature Study, there are "Poisonous Snakes", "The Migration of Birds", "Termites", "Humming Birds", and in Scenery "The Coasts of France", "Italian Lakes", "The Isle of Capri", "Views of Horocco" and "Rivers of the Ardennes". In Military series are depicted the armies of the Balkan States, Germany, Italy, and Austria, also "Ballistics through the Ages", "Special Corps" and even a set on Military Bands. There are sets on such famous men as Mahomet,

Bismark, Julius Caesar, Monard, Rendwindt, Lugenes, sets on Egyptian Gods, gun Worship, The Labor of Hercules, Mediciral Flants, Trees of different Latitudes, and for the ladies "Strange Fe inine Hairstyles", "Honours

awarded to Women", and "Harriage Custo: 3".

--- Editorial Notes: The bove is the., by special permission of Mr Hindmarch, from an article which he wro o for a British publication. We marvel at the number of series which this firm has produced and at first thought Mr. Hindmar h must mean cords instead of series as that figures to nearly 23 sets a year or almost two a month. He mentions no cards printed in English, although the product was sold there and cards issued there in English, as they were in America. We were also surprized at the early date they began. Here in America, Liebig cards are found with the old advertising cards although not in any great quantities. Possibly about 60 American issues are known or around 400 cards. None seem to bear the date of issue but most of them show data on consumption. One series giving yearly consumption as 8 million jars shows the 1887 calendar (Jan-June) as part of the design. About half of the sets show this 8 million consumption figure. A dozen sets show a smaller consumption figure and the remainder give no such data. We would judge U.S. issues as of the I882-I892 period. While entirely in the English language, the early issues were printed in Paris, and later ones in Paris, London, Antwerp, and a few in Germany. We would be glad to hear from anyone who has any of the American issums. Mr. Hindrarch has a few duplicate French issues to exchange for U.S. tobacco cards. I wish to buy Flannels -

WHEN AND LICH HUCH?

Which we have discussed many times, continue to present themselves:

When were tobacco inserts first issued? Frankly, we don't know, and what's more, don't believe that anyone else knows. It is an old tradition that they originated in America, but that doesn't make it so, and similar claims for any other country do not seem to have any stronger foundation. There is some evidence that they first appeared around I880, but we have yet to see conclusive proof. There were many tobacco advertising cards of that date and earlier and some of them could easily be mistaken for inserts. No manufacturer's records have survived. As a matter of fact, even if an insert issue could be proven for such an early date, there would be no proof that it is the first such issue. The question is somewhat analogous to "Who invented the automobile?" Just when the matter seems solved, somebody reports that someone operated a self propelled vehicle in Hamburg or Edinburgh a few years earlier

The question is not one which should bother collectors unduly. The tobacco industry was an infant one in 1880 and if any cards were issued in that period they are not likely to have much effect on the average collection or collecting in general. We are quite sure, though, that tobacco inserts IN QUANTITY appeared about 1886. We think they are a direct result of James B. luke's invasion of the great Eastern market. In April 1884 he arrived in New York city and proceeded to battle the big manufacturers established there. He gave them both barrels of every weapon there was and some new ones he himself invented. He asked and gave no quarter and in five years had them litked and bowing to his terms. Whether or not he "invented" insert cards is a question, but it is certain that he brought them into general use by practically all manufacturers and made them a part of the American life of the day.

Our second question concerns card values and price trends. It so happens that a lot offered at auction sometimes fails to get a bid and the owner immediately concludes that things are going to the dogs. Such things just happen at times in that type of selling. Even a good lot may not get a bid in any one particular sale, and conversely, a poor lot

may happen to get a large number of excessively high bids.

The values in the present Catalog were established early in I946 after judging many considerations. As we all know, a few months afterward there was a decided jump in gractically all price levels, which would seem to make the Catalog about 20% too low today. However, this upsurge is now receding, and any theoretical rise of the past year is further offset by the fact that hobby goals are now, for the first time in five years, in competition with other luxuries and necessities of life. In HOBBIES for Dec. 1916, ir. Lightner officially announces the end of boom prices in hobbies, due to the fact that hobby money can now be spent for automobiles, housing, and other conveniences of which we were deprived during the war years. We think that card values, during the war, were held to a fairly even keel and did not experience any "war boom" in prices as compared to antiques and some other things. consequence, there will be no decided shrinkage due to that factor. growing scarcity of cards and increasing cost of finding them will have an upward tendancy on prices rather than a downward one. Likewise, we believe there will be no shortage of money for purchasing such cards as are offered, especially the scarcer types of cards. We do not anticipate any general price changes for 1947, although the year may develop rises or dips in various groups which can be recorded as they become stabilized. Foreign exchange controls are still holding up a large potential demand. On the whole, it seems likely that values will continue the gradual rise which has characterized the past ten years.
