OLD ADVERTISING CHARACTERISTICS

These few notes occur to us after studying letters on these cards from several collectors and after reading an article on early cards in THE CARTOPHILIC WORLD (London) of April 1947.

While the Catalog devotes several pages to these cards, the intention, as for several other catalog sections, is to give but an outline of what exists and an idea of values. As stated, it purports to list only "outstanding items issued in sets or series". The definition of what is outstanding must, of course, rest with the compiler and on that issue there may, at times, be a difference of opinion. The point is, that there are hundreds of other known "sets and series", most of which are well worth keeping in any general collection but which will not, for the time at least, be catalogued. Likewise the many fine single cards.

These advertising cards run a gamut in design and value. Some are expensively produced original designs, others cheaply overprinted stock designs furnished by printing houses at little cost. Other things being equal, scarcity is the big item in value. In many cases, even the finer designs turn up in such quantity that little value can be attached to them. Any accumulation of a few thousand cards, or a few old albums, will show several specimens. In other cases the beauty is exceeded only by the scarcity and a collector is lucky to obtain a single one. We are, of course, discussing ordinary old advertising of the 1880-1900 period, and not earlier advertising types, insert cards of any kind, or any of the minor specialities.

The article in THE CARTOPHILIC WORLD mentioned above is in reference to the Allen & Ginter advertising card showing Sir Wilfred Lawson and which was first mentioned in Bulletin No. 34. It is illustrated from a photo which we furnished the editor. We think it highly misleading to refer to such cards as cigarette cards (especially in England) or to intimate that they have any insert status, even only as "carton" inserts. We mention such carton inserts in Bulletin No. 13 and as stated there, we do not think such a method of distribution entitled them to insert status as they were purely for advertising purposes and not intended to reach the public. Our idea of an insert is a card packed and sold at retail with a product. Advertising cards are of much earlier origin and distributed differently. To say this card was packed with cigarettes is pure speculation. The ordinary, and more likely way, was the usual salesman to dealer to customers route.

Allen & Ginter produced possibly the best loved group of insert cards known. For them, and the corresponding albums and banners, they spared no cost. For their advertising cards, however, they spared plenty of cost. While some of their emissions in this category are fine original designs, we find them also using cheap stock produced items like the Seeley set (copr. 1881) showing the amorous tomcat and his hated rival; we find them overprinting (front or back or both) the typical gold background French printed cards which must have been bought very cheaply; we find them similarly overprinting what are almost certainly English printed cards (children of the Kate Greenaway type) although the backs of some show the imprint of a Richmond printer. This overprinting of job lots and stock cards was common practice of the day.

Our present opinion on the origin of this Lawson card is that it was one of a job lot of such cards which some printer picked up and sold to

A&G for advertising purposes. The lot may have been all of one kind or assorted portraits and views. While of English origin, the backprinting may have been done there or in America. The date is unimportant as it may have been some years after the card was made. Note that it is not too early, as the cigarettes came in boxes. For cards of similar origin, note the stereoscopic view cards backprinted a little later by The American Tobacco Co., the Prang greetings used by Arbuckle coffee, and in fact, the early Arbuckle inserts (K9 and K10) which are without a doubt imported English printed cards, and many others.

In short, one can expect almost anything in the old advertising group, and generally find it. The combinations are myraid. It is a mistake to attempt to deduce too much from any one card or to jump to conclusions until a thorough study has been made of the group in general, the issuing firm, and the card in particular. Only long study of many thousands of these cards will tend to show the right slant to take when a question arises, and plenty of tough questions do arise.

EIGHT. We mention in passing that this issue marks the completion of eight years of continuous issue of the BULLETIN. We take the occasion to thank readers and advertisers for their continued support. It is most gratifying to have such friendly cooperation. We hope that all will regard the BULLETIN, as we do, as part of our hobby - something done for fun and recreation, rather than for monetary considerations.

We repeat that the Bulletin is mailed on the Monday previous to the date of issue. Third class mail travels slowly and no definite time table for any particular point can be computed. On every issue the non-arrival of a few copies is reported, which we replace if spare copies are available. To possibly help eliminate such losses we have had a new return stamp made with the "Return Postage Guaranteed" clause as this often insures more careful handling for this class of mail.

BRITISH CATS. Several have inquired about the new English catalogs previously mentioned. The Keeves work has run into difficulties which make it impossible to issue as planned. Instead, it will come out in monthly duplicated installments. While this may be a work of merit, we feel that this method will detract greatly from its usefulness and value. There is no further news on the London catalog, which probably will come much later in the year. In the meanwhile, they have issued another abridged catalog, a small booklet showing only English issues since 1919 and selling at 2/3d or 45¢. CLIPPER SHIP CARDS

Gold in California lured thousands to the Coast and set up a tremendous demand for transportation of people, equipment, and supplies. The overland route was rough, slow, and extremely dangerous. The sea route was best, and to fill the need came the speedy little clipper ships of the day, making the long run around Cape Horn in about 100 days time.

Clipper Cards were printed to call attention to the speed, safety, and reliability of the ship. They showed the sailing date, location of the wharf where ship was loading and office of the line. They urged haste in getting cargoes alongside as clippers sailed on the specified date whether loaded or not. If loaded before the date, they sailed immediately, as time could not be wasted standing idle.

Probably but few cards were printed as their "life use" was often but a couple of weeks or less. They were distributed locally to shippers and a few put up in public places. Most of them originated in New York with some from Boston and some from San Francisco for the return trip. The art work was the finest with most of them lavishly colored in bright red, blue, green, gold, and other shades.

One of the largest institutions of its kind in America has turned over to us its duplicate Clipper cards collected over a period of years and we are thus able to offer collectors a few of these rare cards. As far as known, this is the first time they have been offered singly to collectors, and further such offers are extremely unlikely. These cards were issued in the '50s and early '60s and should not be confused with the steamship line cards issued some thirty years later.

Nine designs are available as follows:

1. Clipper SYREN. Coleman's California Line. Large picture of siren (woman) on rock with clipper offshore. 4x6 $\frac{1}{2}$. Each \$10.
2. Clipper JOHN GILPIN. Sutton & Co's Dispatch Line. Flag at top (gold beehive on red), below, horseman at wild gallop. 3x5 $\frac{1}{4}$. Each \$7.
3. Clipper GEORGE PEABODY. Coleman's Line. Large picture of eagle carrying American flag over clipper at sea. 4x6 $\frac{1}{2}$. Each \$15.
4. Clipper POLYNESIA. Four types. Each \$4.
 - a) Glidden & Williams Line. Small flag only in colors. Larger sketch of ship in bl & white but not too clearly printed. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ x5 $\frac{1}{4}$.
 - b) Merchants Express Line. Flag only in centre of card. 6x4.
 - c) Similar to b) but flag at left of card.
 - d) No picture. Dated 1861. 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ x5 $\frac{1}{2}$ on heavy paper.
5. Clipper RADUGA. Winsor's Regular Line. 1858. Large flag. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ x5 $\frac{1}{4}$. Each \$7.
6. Clipper ALICE BALL. Sutton's Line. Ship's name on large ornate pennant. Small portrait of woman. 6x5 $\frac{1}{2}$. Each \$8.

Horizontal dimension is given first. Condition averages good considering the age of these cards. A few copies with larger defects available at $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ rates. All printed by Nesbitt, New York, except 4a and 5 which are by Watson of Boston. Prices are probably half to a third of what would be considered fair by some authorities.

Because of the extremely limited quantities, we suggest you send no money with order. Tell just what numbers are wanted and we will inform you which of them are available at time order is received. All orders filled in strict order of receipt. Name second and third choice if desired.

FORTUNE SERIES. It would seem all but impossible to complete the Turkish Trophies Fortune Series which is a long set of 505 cards and not too common, but with the help of a few collector friends it has been done. After getting 491 of them, we made a list showing the missing 14 and showed it to Mr. Bray who waved his magic wand and came up with 11 of them, leaving us 3 to go. Encouraged by this, we decided to try Mr. van Brakle and Dr. Kurzrok on the missing ones and lo and behold, they came through 100%. This is grand service and a big orchid goes to each of these three gentlemen. The Fortunes seem to be an honestly issued series, with equal quantities of each card issued. Hence, if the 4 to 1 rule holds, a ny accumulation of about 2000 of these cards should yield one complete set. However, the rule may not work at such ratios when dealing in big quantity sets. Who knows? We do know it won't work for a set like the 550 Mogul Toasts. This comes in five series, the first of which is definately the scarcest. We still lack 49 of the Toasts, of which 26 are of the first series and only 23 of all the other series.

T210 Old Mill Baseball. Mr. Walter E. Corson advises us that the 8 series in this set are as follows: 1-Southern Atlantic League, 2-Virginia League, 3-Texas league, 4-Virginia valley league with mostly West Va. teams, 5-Carolina Assn., 6-Blue Grass League, 7-Eastern Carolina League, 8-Southern League. Also some misspelled names in Series 1: Beuse is BEUSSE, Doshmer is DASHNER, Pickels is PICKELL, schulz is SCHOLTZ. It has previously been noted that all Columbus should be crossed off in #2.

R112 Card-O. Mr. Corson also advises that he thinks all of R112 are Card-O issues although he isn't sure of types 8 and 11 which have a slightly different appearance although appearing at about the same time. Mr. Corson, incidentally, probably knows more than anyone else about these issues as he actively collected them when current. There is also some doubt as to who issued the game type mentioned under type 3. These have a block of color with a number in it in the lower corners below the picture and have a red filigree back of interlaced circles. Cards are known with the imprint of Whitman Publishing Co. and it is possible that the firm used these designs for other firms and purposed than the Card-O (Dietz Gum). Two German planes (Henschel HS 123 and Junkers JU 86K) are known with this game type but not in the regular Card-O series. The filigree back of interlaced circles is one of the backs used in type 8 but in blue. The note after type 6 refers to cards of a similar nature but apparently of English issue. These are known with a compass design on back and also with monument "England Expects" backs.

List 207. Candy #R112-I Card-O General subjects. Series A. Joker backs showing leaping stag. As known, this series consists of 94 cards as follows: 12 Early American, 12 Flowers, 12 Horse, 8 Hunting Dog, 10 Kitten, 12 Latin American, 6 Portrait, 12 Scenic, 10 Ship.

List 208. Candy R112-2 Card-O General, Series B. Backs as for Ser. A. Only 3 groups have been noted: 12 Patriotic, 6 Portrait, 10 Silhouette.

List 209. Candy RII2-12. Card-O Airplanes. This is the new type just listed and is undoubtedly the Series A of the Airplanes although no series is given. Descriptive backs. Included are eleven (#35-45) which are not airplane types but which appeared at the same time and are probably part of the series. All U.S. types planes, the title given being only the first part of the complete name as shown.
