## CARD COLLECTOR'S BULLETIN

INTERVIEW WITH AUCTIONNER BRAY Whole No. 49 Volume X

Returning from vacation, we spent July IIth with Charlie Bray, No. I ace card auctioneer, who probably knows as much about card values as anyone in the country. It seemed a good chance to ask a few questions so we began with the usual "Well, Charlie, how are the auctions going?"

"They're keeping me busy, if thats what you mean" he answered, "just finished getting this list of the 21st sale ready for you; next week the 20th sale closes and lots have to be packed and mailed; then check and number these 21st lots; then maybe a week of comparative idleness after which material for the next sale begins to come in together with bids for this 21st; not to mention numerous inquiries to answer, and so It's a continuous merry-go-gound."

"How are prices holding up?" was the next question.

"I would say very well. Good condition material is averaging well over catalog in nearly every instance. As a rule, the scarcer the material, the more over catalog it brings. That is typical of auction There has been a slight dropping off for a few types of the commoner cards, probably due to the principle demand being pretty well satisfied in these. Then, too, its the summer season when indoor interests usually give way to outdoor activities. On the whole, I lock for a gradual advance. Our auction returns on American cards are still far below what comparative English cards bring over there."

"Condition may be a factor, too", we suggested, recalling how impor-tant that point is in most collecting hobbies.

"Yes", answered Charlie, "collectors are paying a little more attention to that. An English writer recently stated that American cards rarely come in first class state, which is a gross untruth as you and I well know as we have both handled untold thousands of perfect cards. Naturally, in things of this age we find a lot of defects. In this 21st sale, for instance, are a dozen old albums which show more or less damage from water or wear but all are intact and they are well worth a fair bid from anyone who doesn't want to pay catalog plus for superb items. I try to give a good idea of condition in the sales but of course can't go into great detail in a small space. Both your collection and mine still contain many cards in poor condition. I have been waiting for I2 years to replace some of mine but doubt that I'll ever

be able to do it as the second card just doesn't seem to appear."
"Most collectors appreciate that point", we agreed, "at least no complaints of importance have been heard. Another thing we wanted to ask is about the Early candy and gums. There seems to be some contro-

versy about them. What have you noticed?"

Charlie smiled a bit about that one. "Yes, the boys are bidding up those pretty good. I think it concerns the baseball issues almost exclusively. That's a specialized subject and it so happens that the baseball specialists are just a little more enthusiastic than any other They will undoubtedly continue to go above catalog prices for supplies of these cards are not large. However, as catalog prices, I think the rates in the catalog are about what they should be in comparison with other cards."

"What puzzles us" we resumed, "is that this uproar about early gum prices developed suddenly about a year ago. We had asked for price suggestions previous to publication, and while a few replied, only one went into detail by suggesting a price for each individual set. The nublished rates are about the same as his suggestions, yet the ink was hardly dry on the catalog before he sudecal; decided they were far, far too low and almost immediate. Le was joint by the other Maseball fans. I guess its a case of not belt able to plot a everybody all the time. But turning to another subject. What also to highish cards and prices?"

"That, says charlie," is a sig subject. There are thousands and

thousands of cards from England and other countries. Because of exchange restrictions, most collectors over there find it difficult, if not impossible, to buy cards in this country. Quite a few of our collectors like the English cards, but I think the biggest stumbling block has been inability to determine how much to pay for them. Frankly, it's hard to help them much. I sometimes wonder if the English, themselves know what to pay. I am told that for their scarce earmy items they sometimes go up to their catalog prices, but for the vast majority of their cards they seem to have a bewildering scale of percentages of catalog which varies with the collector, the age of the card, the type, condition, etc. and may be anywheres from a tenth to half of their catalogued rates. I was hoping that the new English catalogs coming out this year would sort of strike a happy balance in values which we could understand (like our American catalog) but from what I have heard,

"We are in agreement on that, also, but later on we'll try to clarify the subject a little. Haybe we can get some authoritive article for the Bulletin which will help. But tell me, are you getting many bids on the auctions from new and beginning collectors?"

"Every sale shows at least several new bidders. I'm sure there is a huge potential demand for cards still untapped, from people who have not yet heard of the auction sales and present day card collecting. Locating these people is a slow process but is steadily being done all the time. The new Catalog has helped tremendously. By the way, how

are catalog sales these days?"

"Quite satisfactory. Approximately one half of the printing is now gone. That means that more have been sold in this past first year than were sold in six years for the old I939 catalog. Sales could be speeded up, of course, with more advertising in hobby mediums, but the price of the catalog is so very close to the actual cost that advertising has to be stretched pretty thin in order to cover the expected life of the catalog. Some thought that there would be a new catalog every year, but that is not advisable in works of this kind as the contents and prices change slowly and printing costs would not justify too frequent issues. The I939 adition served for seven years but that was partly due to war conditions. In short, everything seems to be going smoothly and the hobby enjoying a satisfactory normal growth."

NEW CANADA SET COMING. We have been shown proofs of a new series, of 48 small numbered cards to be issued soon by Benson & Hedges, Ltd of Canada. The firm also maintains offices in New York City. The designs show ANCIENT AND MODERN FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT and will appear with Henley Cigarettes. Our principal criticism is that the designs have been reduced to such small size that details are most indistinct.

Vacation this year carried us to Worcester, Mass. where we emjoyed a visit to The American Antiquarian Society. This large national research library is filled with priceless books, prints, manner ripts, and other source material collected through the many years since its founding in ISI2. It has un'old thousands of bookplates, advertising cards, postcards, stereoscope cards, and early prints. It owns Prang's original collection of Greeti g Cards. We were especially interested in about 500 Clipper Ship cards and a couple of the larger paper handbills which, be believe, preceded the cardss

In Hartford, Conn. we stopped for a few hours to repay a visit with Samuel Tanenbaum and see his collection of tobacco advertising material which ranks near, if not at, the top in this category. There were many

things which we had not previously seen or heard of.
Going on to New York we spent a couple of days calling on collectors and dealers in the metropolis. Mrs. Landauer at the New York Historical Society did us numerous favors which we appreciate. Dr. Kurzrok brought out hundreds of cards for our inspection, and his collection has already grown to top rank so that it overflows his card room. Mr. Warshaw showed us his largest item - a cloth backed banner about 5 x 7 feet by Domestic Sewing Machine. We had a nice talk with Mr. Shannon who takes care of the interests of the Greeting Card industry. Mr. Burton showed us a unique uncut sheet of 2I currier & Ives cards which is so choice that he cannot part with it. Mr. Byrne at The American Tobacco Co. chatted with us for a half hour. A h alf dozen other calls took up the available time. We really need at least two weeks instead of two days to cover even the most important points in and around the city. NOTES IN BRIEF

CATALOG ADDITIONS. Lack of time to work on these necessitates holding them until next issue. We have accumulated quite a few of them. At this time we will but mention briefly a few things, some of which you may want to note in your catalog .... A&G Album A2 has been seen with two errors and the other two correctly named designs. This results in two portraits bearing the same name.... The catalog should also mention the two errors in another Indian set - the T73 Indian Life series. The errors are the two "gtalking" cards with transposed names on face. The backs are correctly named. These are twice as scarce and valuable as the A&G eard errors....Mr. Osbornes checklist of the ATC #T410 Illustrated songs shows that there are actually five or six series of these and probably at least 225 different song titles .... Mr. Fred Bason, also of England writes recently of Chinese cards. He states that there are 3 known sets issued with Pin Head cigarettes - an early Duke miniature brand. Our #T459 is a set of (30). Other two are CHINESE INDUSTRIES (25) IO6 a nd CHINESE WARRIORS (est. 60) 256.... Mr. corson adwises that the Ex.Lg T3 Baseball were partly used as store display cards, one being put in each carton for that purpose. Nobody bought a carton in those days as they were larger boxes than today. Possibly these are the ones without the backlists and numbers.

BM CAREFUL. A prominent collector recently sent a deposit to a Mrs. Brooks of linneapolis for a big card collection she was going to send. Nothing arrived, and an inquiry came back marked "Moved, no address". This is an old racket but its first trial in cards, as far as we know.
