CURRIER & IVES CARDS

Currier & Ives and their prints need no introduction to collectors. They have been household words for more than a century. Not so well known, however, are their trade card issues. These were made expressly for advertising use, probably mostly as "stock" items, and today are found with the imprint of many users, as well as without imprint.

These cards are slightly larger and heavier than ordinary postal cards, being approximately 3 1/4 by 5 1/8 inches (sometimes listed as 12mo). Nearly all bear the Currier & Ives name at bottom right and most show the copyright date, which is usually between 1877 and 1882, with 1880 most common. Title of picture is at lower left.

While print dealers handle these cards, they are most often found by those who deal in old advertising cards. Very old scrap albums occasionally have them. Two or three dozen different can usually be picked up quite quickly, but after that additions may come rather slowly.

There appear to be about 100 different titles. The following lists show about that number, but additions will doubtlessly show up. On the other hand, a few of those marked (?) may have to be crossed off due to size. Many of these designs were made in two or more sized prints and it has been impossible to determine, as yet, whether or not these titles were made in the size under discussion.

Collectors usually divide the cards into three groups: 1-The Cigar set, a group made for the cigar trade and incorporating a cigar in the design. 2-The Comic set. 3-The Racehorse set, all but a few of which are fine action pictures of the leading horses of the day. The division is a bit confused by the fact that many of the cigars show comic designs and many of the comics are of a horse nature, but a little experience will readily show the merits of this division.

Some may claim that there should be a fourth series to include Scenery, Portraits, and other general designs. While a few of these subjects may come in this size, it is not likely that any of them were made for trade card purposes. Rather, they are small prints. About half of them are portions of double or other multiple groups of pictures. The Peters list of 1929 and the Cunningham list of 1930 contain many of these titles. The Conninghams list 5735 different C&I prints (many are of the different sizes of the same design) but even this is far from complete as the list herewith shows about 15 titles not included.

The Cigar set has been seen used for Moriega cigars, Sweepstakes cigars, and locals. Comics were also used by Fair Deal cigars and many local establishments. Most common user of the Racehorses were the Horse shoe nail makers - Vulcan and Champion, also Lion harness leathers, and others. At least half of the cards are found unused.

The value of these cards is still somewhat unsettled. Years ago they commonly sold for \$1. each, and even yet a few dealers rate them at \$1.50 or so, but as a rule, few can be obtained for less than a \$2. minimum. Many dealers rate them at \$3. to \$4. each, and this is probably none too much for the scarcer titles. One leading collector with about 60 titles writes: "I feel that these C&I cards have a real value and I know that they are going to be real top items as time goes on. Already I have paid up to \$5. for them." This figure is unusually high and a bit out of line in the usual C&I price scale. An authority on C&I values states that in his opinion from \$2. to \$3.50 is the correct range, with

the comics in the \$2.-\$3. range and the racehorses \$3.-\$3.50. Some titles are more common than others. In the list, these commoner ones (mostly horse-comics) have been marked with an "A". A few titles have been seen in uncolored (b&w) form as well as colored, and while less plentiful, the b&w probably rate about two-thirds the colored value. Damage, of course, should also be figured. The imprint of a user, or lack of such imprint, seems to have little effect on value.

VISITOR. We were happy to have as a recent caller, Mr. H.A. Jansen of New York City who was vacationing in this vicinity. He also stopped at Mr. Bray's home. Mr. Jansen is an official of the Metropolitan Post Card club and an experienced collector in several lines.

ENGLISH CATALOG PRICES. A leading collector of England writes us as follows: "In regard to your query on prices of English cards, condition is of paramount importance. A set may be catalogued at ten pounds and if in really first-class condition will bring a half to two-thirds catalog, but if any of the cards are defective it will probably be sold for one-quarter to one-sixth catalogue. It should also be borne in mind that there are a number of competing firms, the largest is The London Cigarette Card Co. but there are a number of others of considerable importance. It is the custom of these firms to compete with each other. With the really scarce issues this competition amounts to very little." This probably summarizes conditions today. Whether or not the coming new catalogues will materially change these conditions remains to be seen. We will report any further news.

NEWS NOTES. BOBEL'S HOUR. Elsewhere Louis Babel announces the launching of a new endeavor of considerable merit. We are sure that collectors in the metropolitan area will welcome this effort. Special invitations have been sent to groups representing collectors of cards, Christmas seals, precancels, playing cards, buttons, and similar interests. Most collectors have more than one interest, and as we mentioned awhile back, Mr. Bobel himself collects almost everything. Run over to Newark next Sunday afternoon and see for yourself.

RESEARCH. Col. Sturtevant, who likes to browse through old papers, was recently going through some CLIPPER ALMANACS published by the N.Y. CLIPPER, a sporting and theatrical weekly, and in the 1880 edition, (issued late in 1879) noted an adv. of THE AMERICAN NEWS CO. who supplied periodicals, tobacco, etc. to news stands. Under "Cigarettes" they quoted "Marquis of Lorne, an all tobacco cigarette packed in neat paper boxes of 10 each, with a portrait of the Marquis in every box. \$9.00 per M". We have long had one of these "Marquis of Lorne" cards but could not determine its origin or use. It is a lithoed card of the Hall Actress type. In the file of the weekly CLIPPER he found many ads in the period of the 70s and early 80s offering small photos of actresses, prizefighters, etc. Ed James & Co of New York offered the sporting types at 5¢ each and W.H. Reed of Detroit sold "Rare Stage Beauties" at 100 for 25¢. We are not sure just what these were but they may have been of the Carte de Visite type (miniature cabinet photos) which were made in great quantity at this period, and even earlier.

PROOFS. We have now received a few more proof sheets of the new Benson & Hedges Canadian ANCIENT AND MODERN FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT. The sheets are of 256 subjects (over 5 sets) on heavy paper. We are told that the set is now in issue, and that they may be in this heavy paper form. While they last, we can supply as follows: Sheet with front and back fully printed (possibly as issued) at \$1.25. Pairs, fronts in two colors and in one color, scrap or plain backs, at \$1.10 the pair.

PUBLICITY. Mr. R.N. Hoover, who writes a column in Mekeels Stamp Weekly, recently gave our hobby a fine bit of publicity for which we thank him. Inquiries and orders for the Catalog have been coming to us in considerable quantity and we note the names of several leading philatelists of the country. We are happy to welcome them to the growing group which is finding pleasure with cards.

BANDS. Louis J. Rerra shows us publicity received in connection with the national convention of the International Cigar Band Society which was held in Brooklyn Sept 4-6. He writes that it was a highly successful meeting. He featured his "World's Most Beautiful Car" - a vehicle covered on its entire exterior with cigar bands.
