Two nights at East Bangor with Mr. Bray enabled us to discuss cards and things in a really thorough way. Nothing stimulates a hobby like a good talk and a chance to inspect the other fellow's rarities. I was impressed again with the enormous amount of work required to run the Mail Sales. Sorting and setting values on the many lots requires an unbelievable amount of time and my opinion is that the IOS commission is well earned. Mr. Bray has moved his office into a larger room with generous cabinets and shelves, and is yet crowded. To help a little on the time element, the closing date of sales is being pushed ahead to the IOth of the following month instead of the 15th. This still leaves more than adaquate time for bidders and allows Mr. Bray to get sale results to me earlier. As mentioned before, it is impossible to handle large amounts of work late in the month. So watch your dates for als and Sale Bids - it's the IOth of September at latest.

In New York, I was able to attend the third meeting of the dight the Card Society and was enjoyably entertained by Dr. Kurzrok and his good wife, whose ideas on refreshments are above criticism. I was pleased to find hrs. Lund and another lady whose name I cannot recall present, which prompts me to advise us makes never to discount the feminine collectors. They are building some important collections, especially in the non-insert fields, and are more enthusiastic than many men.

I could not stay the entire evening, and the regular routine was held up to show me many new items that had been acquired within the past year. Among them were two huge giant-size scrap albums containing what had been a very large collection of the old tobacco poster banners. The sad part is that the album maker had thought best to cut up the banners into their component parts and rearrange things to suit his own tastes. While the value was pretty well shattered, it all gives a lot of additional information on these things. Several sets of cards apparently had two banners. One of these was the Kinney Military, one of the more intact items, which showed the four state seals with the gray background instead of the gold as seen on most cutouts.

I was also shown what seems the most practical mammer of mounting flannels and rugs. A scrap album about I5 by 20 was used, although similar pieces of cardboard could also be employed. The pieces were fastened with Scotch double sided tape. A small bit of the tape about one half inch square under each corner holds everything firm and smooth and yet removable with ease. This tape comes in large rolls of various widths. The half inch is wide enough for this purpose. Use plenty of

binders so albums will not be too bulky and heavy to handle.

I was happy to find that the society had made a start on the very job I would have recommended for them - a checklist of card set titles. The I9th issues will be done first. These lists are long out of print and are greatly needed to fill the needs of new collectors who are joining the ranks all the time. The work will require a long time and

nothing will be available in the immediate future.

The Society is also endeavoring to contact issuers of new card sets and assist members in obtaining these mets. For instance, I was presented with a set of Cartoon Comics candy cards just issued with the compliments of the James O. Welch Co. of Mass. This type of service more than repays the cost of membership in the society.

METROPOLITAN NOTES

It was finally possible, late in June, to forward the Duke and Goodwin insert cards to the Museum. There were 6369 of the former and 2227 Goodwins. In addition, 27 cards were added to the Alien & Ginters previously sent. Largest item in the Dukes were the small #I45 Actresses which went to I87I different and there were over 1500 in the various large sizes. The goodwins included 148 of the scarce cabimet size baseball players and I465 in the small. There were 60 complete sets.

I should point out that I have made no effort to accumulate a big quantity collection. Little attention has been paid to cards of the same series but by different firms or with different brands. Some duplication of designs is knewitable, especially in the photo actresses, but in general, one card of each design has been sufficient. Several other collection s, now in formation, may eventually become larger than other collection s, now in formation, may eventually become larger than this one as in many series it is possible to obtain large quantities which differ only in minor details. For an art museum, a collection like mine may be the more desirable sort, although I have collected only according to my own inclinations and not especially for a museum.

Unfortunately, Mr. Mayor and I had conflicting dates and I missed seeing him while in New York. However, I was well cared for by his assistants and was able to scout around a bit on mounting possibilities. Several additional methods were found and it appears that the work can be begun within a short time. It may be possible for us to get together at some place later in the year. At the start, Mr. Mayor predicted that this entire job would take years and I thought it an unduly long estimate, but I can now see how, rightly done, it will need a much longer time than I had thought.

I append a list of various items still lacking in the various sets sent to date and will appreciate whatever assistance other collectors may be able to give me in filling out these sets.

It has been impossible as yet to thoroughly revise the checklist of these cards in Bulletin #50. Three titles have been added to the original list. All the cigar titles have been seen and this section is probably complete. In the Comics, #6 should be crossed off, as while this is probably a C&I print, it does not bear their name. A similar print (Uncolored) titled "SHOO FLY!" (big fly biting horse) is likewise undoubtedly C&I but lacks name of any printer. In the Racehorses #6 also should be crossed off as this is only a small later reproduction of a large C&I print.

None of the seven titles followed by a (?) have yet been seen and it is likely that most or all of them do not exist in this size. The final total of the trade card issues will probably be about 100, or possibly slightly less. The Peters collection of prints, largest in the country, was willed to the N.Y.Public Library. It is now in storage

awaiting settlement of details regarding its display.
