Bulletin #46 contains a short resume of Liebig issues. These cards are international in scope, but the catalog number H449 refers only to the sets issued in America - a comparatively small part of the total. American issues have backs printed in English, although many of them (the faces, at least) were printed in France with French picture titles.

These cards have received much attention by British collectors in recent months, and our friend Mr.C. Glidden Osborne has done considerable research on them. The leading catalog is the 1933 Janssens (Belgium) and Mr. Osborne can supply copies of this at the cost of \$2.50.

Liebig Company has again resumed the issue of card sets.

The following brief checklist shows the sets seen in America. Sets I-7 are ID cards each, all others of 6 cards. Sets I-6 are mostly designs of children in various activities. The sets are listed in the approximate order of issue. No.I is No.25 in the Janssen catalog. Early sets (among the first hundred of Janssen list):

Titles given these sets are: Armies, German Army, English Army, Sundry Cavaliers, Puss in Boots, Negroes, The Chase, Cooks and Undercooks, Children playing musucal instruments, National Dances, National Costumes, Conundrums, The Five Senses, Comical Animal series, Tournaments, Extract of Meat, Beauties with Fruits, Merchants, Carnival in Italy, Salute with Flowers, Women in different skirts, Proverbs, Sports. (All 1887-1895 issues)

The usual back inscription gives a group of recipes for .

Beef tea, Soups, Sauces, Night Caps, etc.-some with small illustrations.

The 53 sets listed would total 360 cards. A collection of 200 is a large

one and a number of the individual cards are not yet known.

1939 and 1940 STANDARD OIL WESTERN SCENIC VIEWS While the make-up of the I94I and later series are well known, there is a surprising lack of information as to what comprises the two earlier series of Western Scenic Views. The issuing company itself seems to have no record of this data. As far as known, no collector has them complete. This list is probably neither complete or accurate.

The IS39 and I940 titles are often confused with each other, and to some extent, with the 1941 titles. These two early years have an overall size of about 9 by 12 inches with the 1939 very slightly the larger. 1939 were issued only in Arizona and Oregon, and descriptive line at the bottom begins "See Arizona" or "See oregon". In 1940 it begins "See Your West". Both years pictures came in an envelope, white in 1939, gray in 1940. Titles below are as on the picture, not as on envelope. This is important as there are several variations. Especial thanks to Mr. H. F. Kenworthy and Mr. Ed. Whittaker for assistance in compiling.

Several other titles have been reported for 1940 but cannot be confirmed and are likely 1939 or 1941. Because of the scarcity of these years, a valuation, with envelope, of \$I. for 1939 and 50¢ for 1940 is probably none too high. Hawaii and Canada titles and one or two others are probably worth more. Contrary to predictions, there was no new issue in 1948, although one or two areas gave out some of the 1947 series -possibly reprints or remainders. These are extremely expensive things to produce and probably will not be continued yearly.

The catalog figure of 20¢ is probably a fair average value for other years, although the small 1942 issue is scarce and certain titles of other years likewise. The 5 1942 titles are: [California Poppies. 2)

METROPOLITAN NOTES

Big news this month is that due to the generosity and public spiritedness of John D. Wagner the Metropolitan collection will include a copy of that much wanted T206 Hans Wagner card. Mr. Wagner realized that the collection should have this card and offered his copy to complete the set. This is the original "discovery" card which Mr. Wagner first spotted among his duplicates. Early lists of the set did not mention this title and it came near being traded off without being noticed. Since then, one or two others have been found but the card remains in such demand that several copies could easily be sold at the catalog value of \$25. or more. It has been mentioned numerous times in the Bulletin and its story is quite well known. Mr. Wagner is also allowing me to check his Goodwin baseball photos for additions to those already in the collection. This will be done before the set is mounted and will make it the finest and largest lot of this series known. Collectors and baseball fans for many generations to come will thank Mr Wagner for seeing these cards. Knowing John personally, I'm sure he will achieve happiness in knowing that these treasures will be carefully preserved and will bring pleasure to so many in the years to come.

Probably nobody will ever know just how many of the small Kinney photo actresses (#245) were issued. I spent the Labor Day weekend sorting through an accumulation of about 4700 and found 86 new ones to bring the collection total to 2037 different. However, 80 of these are what might be called minor varieties, being mostly differences in enlargement of the same neglative, so the total of actually different poses remains at 1957. I would guess there may be a hundred more designs in the series but few of them are likely to be added to the collection as it would require an average of about a hundred cards to yield one addition,

and at that rate it is a slow and costly job.

I did not expect that any of the missing Duke items would be sent in for the collection as most of them are just too scarce to be found quickly. Then, too, I couldn't go into detail on many sets, like the Tinted Photos, where lists are as yet impossible, or some of the larger cards, where there are many frame varieties. I was gratified, though, to have several tell me they had looked for the missing items, especially Mr. Osborne, who wrote a special letter regretting that he had found nary a one after a careful search. The lists, however, will serve to show what is lacking and in time, I hope, will bring some results.

Mr. Mayor reports that the last of his vacations is now over (he takes a week at a time scattered through the summer) and I am planning a quick trip to see him early in October. I want to say that the delay in starting the mounting work has not been his fault. Several times he has been on the point of ordering material but each time I have advised delay - with long letters which were probably more confusing than enlightening. Very soon, I'm sure, the work will begin and before Spring will be going faster than I can send additional material.
