While we are constantly adding items to the catalog, there have been out few things eliminated from its pages. However, it is only natural that a few mistakes were made in such a mass of detail. The Bulletin has already noted a change in classification for several items and other minor corrections. These will not be reviewed here, but a

few other questionable listings can be pointed out.

Fige 14 carries two of these which we have crossed off in our cat-We have decided that #97 is not an insert set but an unusually small advertising series, and as such hardly worthy of cataloging. For a long time we gave them the benefit of a doubt. The same is true of #123, the Playing Cards, which we now believe to be an ordinary advertising deck and not a premium. There are similar decks for Banner Tobacco, Buchanan & Lyall, and numerous cigars -none of which are as yet catalogued. Note, however, that Kinney #24I is now known. These are mentioned on Kinney coupons and each card is pictoral similar to the small Harlequin series.

In the 20th Tobaccos we delete #TIO9 as these now seem to be small card coupons differing only in the series or serial number on the back.

Gum cards list R74 as Goudey 7x9 Indian pictures. We have a couple of items purported as being this series but they should not be listed. Only the picture title is handstamped on back with nothing to show its origin on use. The practice is not to make a listing which cannot be identified with the cards by name of issuer or some other distinctive feature. Lacking that, a listing means very little except possibly to

someone very familiar with the entire arrangement.
Also in recent gums is R329 Foto Fun. It is possible that some retail store did distribute these but without name of issuer or brand their legality is doubtful. We think they should form a part of #W58 which is a similar novelty. #R4IO, sad to say, may be extinct. Once highly stretchable, the rubber is long since brittle or stuck tight to whatever is adjacent to it. It was a good idea, anyway.

Butterfly blankets BI4 are common, but who has them for BI5 in the 34x5 size. We have a single one and it may be just an odd item and not

a definate series that should be listed.
We wonder - were Warners Cubeb digarettes (#481-483) tobacco products or not? If not, these sets are wrongly classified.

Some complete sets were exchangable for premiums. In such cases it was common to find one card missing. If issued, it was only in small controlled quantities, and such sets should be considered complete without these cards. We have no complete list of such sets but a few such cards are #20 in set #385, #I5 in VII7 and VI30, #36 in R5I and #25 in RI72. There are probably several more of these.

There are quite a number of catalog listings for which we do not have a single representative item. In most cases, however, items have been seen and the listing known to be correct. Here are a half dozen unseen things which we think rate at least a question mark until at least a single specimen is reported: #337 Actress cabinet photos by Hess, #502b Occupations for Women by Cameron & Cameron (maybe English), #T305 Miniature Novels 34x5 by American Tobacco, #CII3 Autograph Series by Tuckett of Canada, #SI09 silk Steamship Line Pennants, and #R340 While on the subject, there are four tobacco Sport Kings extra large.

most of them will probably come to light.

It can be seen why we usually ask to see any new item before a listing is made. Too often it is already listed or not of listing status. Such samples are returned, of course, although sometimes not too promptly as we often cannot find time for immediate responses. We do appreciate, though, the interest of wollectors and welcome their news and inquiries about any doubtful catalog listings.

Mr. T.D.deBlois supplies us with considerable information on Canadian cards including data on some uhlisted iters. He states that the Benson & Hedges Fire Engine series is now in issue with Henley digarettes but are not seen too much as both the cards and the cigarettes seem short on popular appeal. He says the "Big 4" in Canadian cigaretes are Sweet Caporals, Players, British Consols, and Black Cat, - not a one of them the same as our Big 4 in the U.S.A.
