Physically, however, it has been a bit different and many issues have been gotten out under somewhat distressful conditions. As many of you know, I have been bothered considerably by chronic arthritis, and in recent years it has all but precluded any unnecessary activities. Some will also recall that a year ago I was hospitalized for a month with a leg ailment somewhat similar to that suffered by King George. These, and other things, have required intermittent medical attention, and all in all, I am not in proper condition to continue magazine publication - the work on which must be done regularly in limited spare times - and so I have deemed it wise to put the job into more capable hands.

I greatly appreciate the loyal support which has been given me by readers and advertisers. Their help and good wishes have been a powerful stimulant during the years. I feel that the BULLETIN has been serving a useful purpose and has made card collecting a pleasanter avocation and study. It has grown tremendously in both size and circulation and there

is still a large field of usefulness ahead for it.

Your new publisher, Mr. Charles R. Bray, needs no introduction. Since the introduction of the Mail Sales over five years ago he has handled that part of the hobby and built it into a vast constructive element. In fact, it is hard to see how the hobby could really live today without these sales. During these years Mr. Bray, himself, has attained the reputation of being a "square shooter" with a real enthusiasm for cards and with the best interests of the hobby at heart at all times.

I will, of course, assist Mr. Bray as much as possible. He has asked me to handle data on new issues and catalog additions and all such information may still be sent to me. I hope to do this better than in the past. I wish to make an appeal to all readers to assist Mr. Bray with news and articles. Many are capable of writing short feature articles and research studies on card topics. The BULLETIN will continue to be your magazine and support of this kind will always be appreciated.

Matters concerning subscriptions and advertising should hereafter be sent directly to Mr. Bray at East Bangor, Penna. The rates for these have remained substantially unchanged since the start despite the greatly increased costs of paper, postage, and other supplies. That was because I have considered the magazine as part of my card hobby and was content to overlook occasional small deficits, in addition to doing the entire

work of publication without consideration of the time and labor involved, and I wish to assure you that the time and labor required is much more than anyone would dream possible for so small a publication. Since Mr. Bray will have to hire some of this work done, he will of necessity have to increase rates a small amount. These increases, in fact, should have been made some years back when costs began to advance. For subscriptions, the new rate will be 50¢ per year, with present subscriptions carried to their expiration at the old rate. The advertising rate will be 40; for \$\frac{1}{2}\$ page, and \$\frac{1}{2}\$I.30 for full page advertisements. These rates are fully justified by increased costs and increased circulation. I am sure all readers will realize that the Bulletin, for a speciality publication, still has extremely low rates.

Again, I thank you all for your past support. With its continuance, I'm sure that the Bulletin, under Mr. Bray, will appear regularly and add its bit to a hobby which has few equals in interest and pleasure. In fact, with a little extra effort from everyone it can easily become bigger and better than ever. Let's all do our part. — J.R. Burdick.

Last August four titles were added to this series and the prediction made that four more would be found. These can now be given as: 623-Private, 47th Regt. 624-Lieutenant, Albany Burgess Corps (both N.G. S.N.Y. 887). 625-Captain IIth Hussars. 626 Captain, I3th Hussars (both England 1879). It now seems probable that this completes the listing of different titles in the series at 622 - the difference of four being due to four numbers in the original list being crossed off and given an a) minor number. The last resume of this series was made seven and one half years ago. Following is the present status of the series: Group-Quantity COLORED BACKGROUND TYPES

A-50 Collection No.7 (number "7" in lower left commer). B-50 Collection No.8 (List on back).

C-30 Set No.9 (List on back). These back lists differ slightly from the face titles but can easily be identified.

D-50 Designs similar to A,B & C. (no set number) Includes 21 foreign soldiers, II State soldiers, 8 Native types, 5 Military Decorations and 5 State Seals.

E-50 Foreign I886 types, Name in white panel at bottom. Each of these is known in a minor a) variety in which the colored bkgd is omitted (see Note I). Two have also been seen in a sub-minor b) variety in which only the red color in bkgd is missing (see note 2).

F-26 Remainder. Includes IS Continental soldiers, 3 Vatican types, and 5 Decorations. One of the Continentals (#7) and one Vatican (#603) are known in a white bkgd.a) variety. The Decorations (see list in Catalog arrendix) are scarce and three of them are known in two varietics, the difference being in the color of the centre bkgd. Probably the other two similarly exist. (see Note 3).

WHITE BACKGROUND TYPES G-51 U.S.Army and Navy. Eight of the Army designs come in an a)minor

variety with a fine red dotted background.

H-85 U.S. State types. These can be further divided into 5I with a large figure and 34 small figure. In the smaller, the initials of the brand name (I-S-C) are larger than other letters of the words.

I-60 U.S. and Foreign. Brand name is set in 3 lines at side. Includes Jamaica error - which looks like a name error and correction but may also otherwise be accounted for.

J-50 U.S. & Foreign. Includes the I9 N.G.S.N.Y. and 31 England.

K-50 Foreign I853 types. Inscription in two lines. L-50 Foreign types. Inscription as E group but not all are dated I886. M-20 Remainder, Includes I5 French Army & Navy I886 types and 5 State

Seals with Gray bkgd. The seals come in 2 varieties - with and 622 without a blue edge. (Pa.not seen thus but probably exists) (Note 3)

To these should be added the 5 listed cutouts (4 wertical designs in M-group seals and name error #226a). The total number of

varieties may thus, with 5 cutouts, be approximately 85 to 90.

Note 2-These two b) varieties are Sweden #543 and 547. They possibly are printing errors, in which case IO or II more may exist as such groups of 50 were usually printed with 4 plates of I2 or I3 designs each. Some of the ARCD groups were printed in strips by another method.

Note 3-There is, in actuality, no major-minor status for these five Decorations and the five gray bkgd seals. They are of equal scarcity and value, and eit' r variety may be considered ad quate for completing the series - which with little doubt, stops at the 622 figure.

CATALOG SCREENING. Only two collectors have sent in any information about these doubtful items. Mr.C.Glidden Osborne of England verifies set 502b, the Occupations for Women by Cameron & Cameron. He has 19 of them, which makes us wonder if they all went abroad as none are seen here. Their backs give a Richmond, Va. address and state that the firm received the only award for tobacco at the 1893 Columbian Exposition. Mr.T.D.deBlois of Ottawa writes about Cubebs "There's not a shred of tobacco in them, in fact, that was the main reason parents in the nineties let their children smoke them as a remedy for catarrh, colds, etc. They're made from a dried tropical plant." Now we wonder where they should be catalogued - maybe back in that "etc" group at bottom of page 97. It seems the only place, or shall we be lenient and let them remain as is? Who can tell any more about any of these or any other listing about which there is any doubt? Non-existant items are often carried on from old catalogings when they should be checked and crossed off.
