Cigar Bands as a Hobby.

Cigar bands may not have any particular relation to the Card field except the few 2550-52 items. However, those had their popularity at about the same time as the cigarette cards, in the period about 1907, when band collecting, and cigar band plates were all the rage. Of course, the bands that are in current use hardly compare with those of yesteryear, and the early ones are the bands that are of particular fascination.

In looking thru the collection we find such figures commemorated as the great Hans Wagner. How this cigar passed his approval is probably a mystery, knowing his aversion to smoking. Then we find Anna Held, Lillian Russell, Lawrence Barrett, John Drew, Joe Jefferson, John Hampden, Larry Bell and Jack Norworth, to mention a few of the great actors and actresses pictured on bands. All the Presidents are represented from Washington to McKinley in various sets, and Taft and F.D.R. on larger Campaign Bands. Here is a band from Angel's Camp of the old Gold Rush days, and there is one of the old Victor Talking Machine Company, and another one of Admiral Dewey's Flagship "Olympia," all commemorated with bands. Some of the significant trends in bands are the various changes of companies. For instance, we see the prominent "Harvester," starting with Fay Lewis Bros. Co., then by Samuel Davis & Co., then to be absorbed by the Consolidated Cigar Company. Here we see changes in the design of bands, such as the Optima Cigar. Of course, we have the various series bands, like the Playing Cards, Flags, Presidents, State Seals, to mention a few; and from foreign sources such figures are represented as King Edward, King George, Leopold, Albert, Bismarck, Kaiser Wilhelm, Alfonso XIII, Belisario and Sun Yat Sen, these are but a few.

Band collecting, at the present, is growing to be very popular again, with more foreign contacts being made, thereby putting it on an international scale. The hobby today reaches all through the major cigar countries which have their excellent share of bands. Such countries as Belgium, Cuba, Spain, Germany and Holland are all being wrought into one great collecting circuit, and band collections of today far outdo those of the 1907 era, when bands were in their heyday.

The one thing that probably makes band collecting so fascinating, is that regardless how large a collection one owns, there is always something new to be added, and each new band an interesting discovery.

Metropolitan Notes.

The latest shipment to the Museum consisted of 71 of the Tobacco Albums and 2087 Tobacco Advertising items. The albums included a few minor varieties, lacking some half dozen of completeness. The advertising items covered everything from the largest banners and cards, some nearly four feet long, to a few tiny labels and stickers hardly larger than a postage stamp, but no cigar box labels, bands, or tin tags were sent at this time. I haven't the least idea how the Museum will handle these larger things, but doubtless some way will be developed to make them available for inspection. Many are really beautiful and unique.

On reaching home from Paris last Spring, Mrs. Troyer of Seattle sent me an A&G "Little Beauty" that was lacking in the collection. She writes: "I would like to see the card in the Metropolitan. All rare cards should be there. I think this Little Beauty rather dates itself as the wide double bracelets this girl wears came into vogue at the end of the Civil War, and were popular for a number of years thereafter. My daughter has a pair which were given her great grandmother on the occasion of the birth of her first child in 1871. The style probably lasted for a few years after that date."

The Museum plans to begin work this Fall on a vast program of modernization, which will require several years to complete. Initial plans show a Print Room on the second floor, but latest advices indicate that the Print Study Room may remain somewhat near its present location on the ground level. However, there will be street entrances at this level, making unnecessary the present necessity of climbing up and down stairs. Such a plan will make the card collection much more accessible. Many departments will be relocated and new escalators, lighting and ventilating equipment installed throughout the building.

Varieties

On two or three occasions the Bulletin has discussed varieties - their types and origin. In many cases it is impossible to state exactly how they originated and whether they are errors, cutouts, proofs, specimens or what-not.

During the use of a set of insert cards there was often put out some sort of publicity such as banners, window cards, and small counter cards. Many of those show reproductions of the insert cards and are often the origin of plain backed varieties, (where they should be printed) and unfolded varieties (that should show a crease) etc. Recently some #153b, Duke's Governors in the thin type, were found in uncreased form which had, of course, never been in cigarette box. One theory is that they have been gift sets - presented as a souvenir by some official of the printer or issuing firm. Usually some few sets are thus given away or retained by the officials themselves. Collectors must add another brand to the many using the popular T206 designs. .. single card by Ty Cobb Tobacco has been found. It shows the red background portrait, and it is not known whether other players were used. Few details are shown, other than a North Carolina factory.

Kate Greenaway's designs
on Early American Trade Cards.

The influence of designs on American Trade Cards is definitely shown in early cards. I have done extensive research work on Kate Greenaway, who was an English artist and illustrator of children's books. She was born in Hoxton, England, March 17, 1846. Her first published illustration that has come to our notice is in "Infant Amusements," Wm. H. Kingston, publisher 1867, and certainly to look at this, one would never suspect it was from the pen of Kate Greenaway. We have a few scattered books with perhaps a frontispiece or a few illustrations by her, but in 1879 she created her own fashion in "Under the Window." These verses are her own literary thoughts, pictorially illustrated by her, and from this volume a great many Trade Cards have been copied. Also in the same year 1879 she designed a double page in color for the Illustrated London News, and I have a set of six Trade Cards taken from these illustrations. Kate Greenaway was also making illustrations for "Little Folks Magazine" an English Childrens Magazine at this time, and I have found five advertising cards taken from some of these illustrations.

In the year 1880 she illustrated 382 tiny drawings in the "Birthday Book." Some of these illustrations have been reproduced on Trade Cards. In 1881 she illustrated "Mother Goose" or "The Old Nursery Rhymes"; I have discovered nineteen trade cards with exact illustrations of these plates, and I believe the entire book was reproduced in trade cards. There are forty-four plates in the book, so I have a long way to go to complete my set. These cards were used by J.P. Coats thread and Metropolitan Mfg. Co. as a medium of advertising. They have gold background with some red, some blue, and some brown outline. A great many of the trade cards were typical and not identical; and sometimes the designer has taken two Kate Greenaway children and combined them in a different surrounding, but used the same stance.

The Sunshine Publishing Co., of Philadelphia printed a set of five or six cards larger than most of the trade cards, and these illustrations were from "Under the Window." This same company did a set of four cards, children in flowers, which were exact reproductions of a set of English Greeting Cards, published by Marcus Ward, Belfast, Ireland, which I feel certain are Greenaway Cards, although they are not signed.

I have found cards of twenty different sets of K.G. children and I hope I can complete these sets. Will be glad to hear from any collector who has any of these to either sell or exchange. It seems odd that these trade cards are not known in England, although Kate Greenaway was an English illustrator and artist. She died in Hampstead, England, November 6, 1901, but her influence on design in the nineteenth century was very far-reaching, and I feel will never be lost.

In regard to an article in the August Bulletin, "Early Candies," Mr. Gray has asked me for some notes on these items. My limited recollections may be of interest to some collectors. These early candy cards, particularly E 300, were available in New York City candy stores around 1922 to 1925, and probably before 1922. They sold for a penny the strip of 10. They were known as 'tickets', and the kids had several ways of playing with them. One was to flip a designated number on the sidewalk, which had to be correctly matched as to heads and tails (picture up or down) by the opponent. Another popular method was to have 2,3 or 4 players each with a stack face down, taking turns in turning over their top card. When a player matched the first letter of the preceding card, he collected the stack that had been turned over. Varieties of the strips available were hung up in the windows of some candy stores, and a kid cleaned out would rush to the store and put down his penny or two. I don't know for anybody being interested in getting a full set together, the object was to see who had the most filled cigar boxes. They were never issued with candy to my knowledge, and probably weren't remainders; too many people had too many of them for years.
